

Documentation Guidelines for Traumatic Brain Injuries

Boston College is committed to providing reasonable accommodations and modification for students with disabilities under the Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act (ADAAA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. To establish that an individual is covered under the law, the documentation must explain how the disability substantially limits one or more major life activities, and supports the request for services, accommodations, academic adjustments, and/or auxiliary aids.

Students who wish to request academic accommodations based on a traumatic brain injury must submit documentation from a specialist who is qualified to evaluate and diagnose traumatic brain injuries. The documentation should be in English and must x Current treatment plan
