My husbanddid not have a driver's license, and he gave the police a false ID. My husbandis from Guatemala He is undocumented, that is, he does not have papers that give him legal immigration status in the United States. I am sadbecause the police stopped him while driving and he is now in detention.

I work as a cleaner in a restaurant downtown to support my children. I have a busy routine. During the week, Iget up at 7 in the morning and have breakfast with my children.
